

Norma I. Brewer was a longtime resident of Main Street in St. Johnsbury. She died at her St. Johnsbury House residence surrounded by family Tuesday evening, Sept. 6, 2011, at the age of 89.

Her brother Truman passed away in 1998; her sister Donna Allard passed away tragically in 1974. She was also predeceased by three nieces: Norma Mae Shumway, Martha Davis, and Anna Morton.

Graveside services will be held this Saturday, Sept. 10, at 11 a.m. at the St. Johnsbury Center Cemetery. Mr. John Sleeper will officiate at the service with military honors concluding the service. Anyone wishing to attend is welcome.
