Elwyn E. (Bud) Carr, of Syracuse, N.Y., and Newark, Vt., died Saturday, June 3, 2006, at the age of 83 years. He was born in Newark, Vt. May 25, 1923, the son of Elmer and Vera (Beck) Carr. Bud attended West Burke Elementary School and graduated from Lyndon Institute in 1941. He joined the U.S. Air Force and served in the 12th division during WWII, sailed on the liberty ship "General Mann." He was an expert at fly fishing and enjoyed building his second home at Newark Pond, Vt. All who knew Bud would testify to his sense of humor and tendency to tease everyone, including old friends, relatives, golf buddies and waitresses.
