Frieda Lucille Powell passed away peacefully on Sunday, June 14 in Matthews, North Carolina, at the age of 91. She was born Aug. 17, 1923 in Sheffield, Vermont the second daughter of Delmer and Dora Adell (Davis) Boardman.
