

Mary Louise (Laflamme) Keach, age 88, St. Johnsbury, VT, formerly of Concord, VT passed away Friday, December 2, 2016 at Maple Lane Nursing Home surrounded by her family.

Mary was born in Lyndonville, VT, on March 2, 1928, daughter of Paul and Arlene (McCosco) Laflamme. She attended St. Johnsbury Academy graduating in 1946.
