

Clifford Greenwood Obituary

Clifford Greenwood, of Sand Hill in St. Johnsbury, passed away at home Wednesday, April 20, 2011. Many of his close friends and family knew him "Oskey."

He was born in Woodsville, New Hampshire on Aug. 13, 1929, and was the last survivor of seven children born to James L. and Nina (Chandler) Greenwood. In 1975 he was predeceased by his wife, Betty (Aiken) Greenwood.

He was also predeceased by his three brothers: James, Charles, and Duane; and his three sisters: Jeannette Wheelock, Jean Manson, and Frances (as an infant).
