

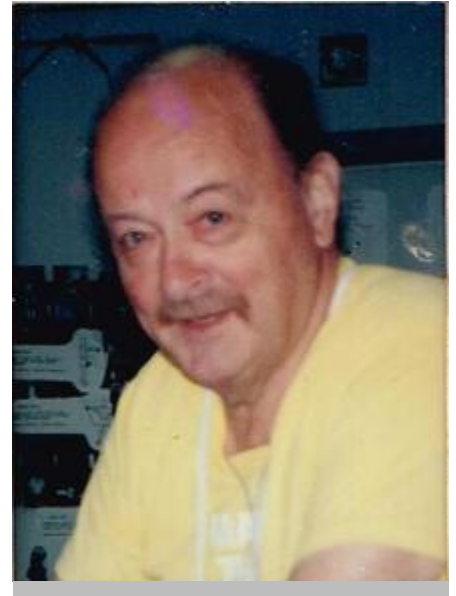
## Robert Alcide Carreau - Obituary

Bob Carreau, of Mt. Pleasant St. in St. Johnsbury, died Monday, Feb. 9, 2015, at the age of 82. He had resided at The Pines in Lyndonville since April of last year.

Bob was born in St. Johnsbury on Sept. 18, 1932, the son of Alcide and Marie Rose (Marois) Carreau. He married Simone Nicole on May 12, 1962.
