

**Albert Russell Mann**, 75, a resident of Oliver Springs, Tenn., died Tuesday, Oct. 9, 2007, at Methodist Medical Center of Oak Ridge. Mr. Mann was born March 7, 1932, in St. Johnsbury, Vt., moving to Oliver Springs in 1961.
