

**David V. Lavigne**, 63, formerly of St. Johnsbury, unexpectedly passed away at his home in Sharpsburg, Ga., on May 5, 2007. Born in Newport, Vt., Dave was the son of Valmore and Doris (Page) Lavigne. He spent his first years in Newport before moving to St. Johnsbury as an elementary school boy. Dave was a graduate of St. Johnsbury Academy and was selected as a member of the 1962 Vermont Shrine Football Team. Following high school graduation, he attended the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colo., after which he served honorably in the Vermont Air National Guard. He married his high school sweetheart and lifelong love, Betty (Kimball) Lavigne of Lower Waterford, Vt., to whom he was married for 41 years. He was employed by St. Johnsbury Trucking Company for 29 years, beginning as a second-shift computer programmer and eventually, through a series of promotions, worked his way up to director of data center operations. Never one to embrace formal titles, Dave will be best remembered for his playful wink, good-natured ribbing, hearty laugh and gift for making those around him feel special and important. He was a devoted, loving husband and father.
