


OBITUARY: Albert Dauphin, 60



Albert Arthur Dauphin died Sept. 8 at age 60, according to his brother, Paul Dauphin. He was gay and had been a Washington resident. He died of pneumonia complicated by CIDP (chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy).

Born to the late Everett and Florence Dauphin on May 22, 1953 in St. Johnsbury, Vt., Dauphin graduated from St. Johnsbury Academy in 1971 and received a bachelor's degree in history from Lyndon State College in 1975.

He began his career with Tauk Tours in 1975 and continued his association with them for 15 years as a tour director and manager. He was in various sales and conference director positions in the hotel industry during the later years prior to his retirement. His last position was with the Radisson Barcelo
