

Roy L. Goodwin, 80, of River Road, South Lunenburg, died at his home Saturday morning, Jan. 27, 2007. Mr. Goodwin was born in Dalton, N.H., on Nov. 10, 1926, the son of Roy L. Goodwin Sr. and Annie (Stone) Goodwin. Roy was raised in the Dalton and Gilman area. During World War II he served with the U.S. Navy. He attended and later taught at the St. Johnsbury Trade School. He worked for the Gilman Paper Company for many years and also Fairbanks Scales in St. Johnsbury. For a time he resided in Concord, N.H., where he was employed at the New Hampshire State Prison for 12 years. In 1980 he returned to Lunenburg. He enjoyed the outdoors and spending time with his family, especially his grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
